Hebrews:1:1-4

Sermon Recap

This Sermon Speaks about the significant themes in the opening verses of Hebrews, emphasizing the incomparable nature, activity, and position of Jesus. He illustrated how God has communicated most clearly through Jesus, contrasting the old ways of the prophets with the direct revelation of the Son. It was highlighted that Jesus's work includes creating and sustaining the universe, making purification for our sins, and sitting at the right hand of the Father, signifying both his completion of redemptive work and ongoing intercession for believers. Ultimately, Pastor encouraged the congregation to recognize the active communication of God through Jesus and to listen attentively to His voice in their lives.

Discussion Questions •

What does it mean when the sermon says that Jesus is the 'radiance of the glory of God'?

- This statement emphasizes that Jesus perfectly reflects God's character and greatness, similar to how sunlight radiates from the sun.
- How can understanding Jesus' nature as the radiance of God's glory affect the way you see Him in your daily life?

In what ways does the sermon explain the significance of Jesus making 'purification for our sins'?

- The message outlines that Jesus' sacrifice cleanses us from sin and allows us direct access to God, which was not possible under the Old Testament system.
- How does knowing that Jesus has purified your sins change your perspective on guilt and forgiveness?

Why does the speaker highlight the concept of Jesus sitting down at the right hand of God?

- Sitting down signifies the completion of Jesus' sacrificial work, showing that He has finished what was necessary for our salvation.
- What does it mean to you that Jesus' work for your salvation is complete and that He is now interceding for you?

Discuss the idea of God's ongoing communication through Jesus, as mentioned in the sermon. How do we discern His voice today?

- The sermon emphasizes that God is actively speaking to us through His son, Jesus, rather than being distant or silent.
- What practical steps can you take to ensure that you are listening and responding to what God is saying in your life?

How does the comparison of Jesus to Old Testament figures and practices help to understand His superiority?

- The sermon draws parallels between Jesus and the prophets, priests, and sacrifices of the Old Testament to show that Jesus is much greater.
- How can reflecting on the comparisons made in the sermon inspire you to deepen your faith in Jesus?
